LEADING A FULL LIFE Rachel Perry Welty feels overwhelmed by all her stuff. Rather than becoming a hoarder or a minimalist, however, she's turned that sensation outward, integrating it into her art. Collages of years' worth of price tags, delicate ropes fashioned from the stickers on fruit, a waterfall-like wall of silver twist-ties: Each is made by dipping a ladle into the relentless flood that contemporary life provides. In this new series, shot for *Vogue*, she all but disappears into fabric and pattern—not only grappling with consumerism but just about swallowed whole by it (May 24 through July 6 at Yancey Richardson).
